## **News**

Turners' meeting. Monday, the 5<sup>th</sup> September 2022 – from 18h00 at Made in Workshop – Trevor demonstrated making a spoon using the lathe to turn the handle. Starting with splitting a blank from a branch, the blank was trimmed using an axe on a chopping block, before mounting on the lathe, between centres. The handle was turned to size and the bowl outline was defined. Off the lathe, the bowl was trimmed further on the chopping block, before the shape was refined by hand. The inside of the bowl was cut using a hook shaped spoon tool. The picture shows a finished example.

Wood of the Month – Blue Guarri. Chris van Heeswijk described the Blue Guarri – Euclea crispa, recently harvested by the woodturners. The tree that was harvested was partly dead and the blue streaks in the wood grain were the subject of some debate. There were theories about whether the blue streaks were the result of stress on the tree, such as periodic veld fires or droughts, or a fungal infection. The piece on the right shows both the blue stain in the growth rings as well as a patch of reddish wood with a black boundary that may be spalting. The distinctive bark is also visible. (The knob on the lid is wild olive.) The tree resembles the Wild Olive in appearance and habit and the wood is similar in appearance, but softer, darker in colour

and contains more resin. The tree is not endangered.


